The City of Granger will host Dino-N-A-Day on Saturday, June 1, beginning at 9 a.m. until approximately noon, at Hisey "Dinosaur" Park located at 505 Main Street, Granger.

Gloves will be provided to everyone, young and old who wants to help apply the cement on the wire-framed structure of Granger's 36th dinosaur the Sauropelta which means Lizard Shield. They existed during the Cretaceous Period of North America and measured approximately 17.1 feet long, their tail making up about half of its body length.

The Saurapelta, pronounce (SAWR-o-PEL-t9), was a medium sized nodosaurid. Their body was smaller than a modern black rhinoceros they had about the same mass, weighing in at approximately 3,300 lbs. The extra weight was due to extensive covering of bony armor, including the large spines that project from its neck.

Granger's Saurapelta will measure approximately 25 feet long and 6 feet high.
